

# SUBMISSION DEADLINE: MONDAY JANUARY 12, 2026 11:59PM PST

We invite you to submit **ABSTRACTS** showcasing research and insights across all areas of clinical microbiology and infectious diseases, including epidemiological, diagnostic, environmental and medical microbiology, and basic sciences. Submissions related to education in microbiology and infectious diseases are also encouraged.

In addition, we welcome **CASE REPORTS** that highlight issues of interest and relevance to the infectious disease and microbiology community. Beyond traditional clinical stories, we strongly encourage case reports focused on microbiology, stewardship, and infection control.

\*One submission site is be available for both abstract and case report submissions.

#### **GUIDELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS AND CASE REPORTS**

To be considered, an abstract/case report must comply with the rules of submission set out by the Abstract/Case Report Committee. Before submitting, it is recommended that you thoroughly review the instructions. Submitted abstracts/case reports that do not follow the required format will be rejected.

**Abstracts/case reports cannot exceed 300 words** as identified in the submission system. Submissions exceeding 300 words will not be permitted or accepted. It is recommended that you prepare your abstract/case report's text prior to submission and save a copy on your computer. The text can later be copied and pasted into the online submission form. Please note that the submission site word counting mechanism may differ slightly from other word processors (i.e., MS Word).

**Tables and Figures:** The inclusion of tables and figures in abstracts or case report submissions is strongly discouraged. If deemed essential, only one (1) table or figure will be permitted. **Authors are encouraged to incorporate tables, figures, and illustrations into their poster or oral presentation rather than in the submitted abstract or case report.** 

## Tables:

- · Cannot contain more than four (4) columns
- · Must be submitted in a high resolution, editable format (i.e., as a Word or Excel table).
- · Screen shots and PDFs are not permitted.

#### • Figures:

- Must not exceed 3.5' in width
- · Must be submitted as high-resolution jpeg or png files
- Must be a minimum of 750px x 750px at a minimum of 150dpi

\*If image does not follow the above specifications the image will not be included in the publication\*



**No identifying features** such as names of authors or their affiliations, names of hospitals, medical schools, clinics, cities, or provinces may be listed in the title or body of the abstract/case report. The names of the authors and their affiliations (institutions) are entered separately when you submit the abstract/case report online.

**Abstract and Case Report Title:** Your title cannot exceed 50 words. The title should be concise and clearly reflect the content of the abstract. Capitalize only the first letter of the first word of the title and the first letter of the word of a subtitle (if included). Note that proper nouns and genus names should retain their normal capitalization and italicizing. There should be no period at the end of the title.

#### **Abstract and Case Report Text:**

- · Abstract Text: Abstracts should state briefly and clearly the objectives, methods, results, and conclusions of the work
  - **Objective(s):** Clearly state the purpose of the work presented.
  - Method(s): Describe your selection of observations or experimental subjects clearly and concisely.
  - Result(s): Present your results in a logical sequence in text. Illustrations, tables, and figures should be avoided.
  - Conclusion(s): Emphasize new and important aspects of the study and conclusions that are drawn from them.
- Case Report Text: Case Reports should state briefly and clearly the objective(s), case summary and discussion related to the
  case.
  - Objective(s): Clearly state the purpose of the case being presented.
  - Case Summary: Succinctly describe the case in a logical sequence. Illustrations, tables, and figures should be avoided.
  - Discussion: Emphasize unique aspects from the case and take-home messages drawn from it

Abstracts and Case Reports not submitted in the required format will be rejected.

**Authors:** List the first and last names of ALL authors. Middle initials are optional. Email addresses will be required for all authors (for correspondence purposes only).

Affiliations: List each author's institution, city, and province. Use standard abbreviations for the province (e.g., ON, QC, AB etc.)

# **GENERAL INFORMATION AND CRITERIA FOR SUBMISSIONS**

During the submission process, authors will be given the option to specify their preferred presentation format; however, this does not guarantee their choice. The review committee will determine the final presentation format.

#### **Presentation Formats**

#### · Oral Presentation

A 15-minute oral presentation provides the presenter an opportunity to cover their topic comprehensively while engaging with the audience in a meaningful way. The presenter has 10-12 minutes to present and 3-5 minutes to engage in a question-and-answer period. The 15-minute time frame allows for a balanced presentation that is both informative and concise, giving the audience a thorough understanding of the research while leaving room for further discussion.



#### Poster Presentation

Poster presentation is a visual and interactive way to showcase research. The poster should summarize key aspects of the research, including the introduction, methods, results, and conclusions, using visuals like charts, graphs, and images to convey information effectively. This format allows for direct interaction, fostering in-depth discussions, feedback, and networking opportunities within the research community.

#### Rapid-Fire Abstract Presentation

A rapid-fire abstract presentation is a brief and fast-paced format designed to highlight research within a limited time frame. Each presenter has 5 minutes to deliver their key findings, methodologies, and conclusions, including a question-and-answer segment. Additionally, all rapid-fire presenters are required to prepare and present a poster.

The Abstract/Case Report Committee will assign all oral abstract presentations, rapid-fire sessions, and poster presentations. In the case of a scheduling conflict, a co-author may deliver the presentation.

#### · Awards Eligibility

- Only **students/trainees** are eligible to submit for the awards competition.
- In the case of a scheduling conflict, if the presenting author is replaced by a non-student presenter and the abstract is under consideration for an award, it will no longer be eligible for the student award competition.
- · Only abstracts will be considered for the awards competition (case reports are not eligible).

Authors may submit multiple abstracts and/or case reports using the same email address and password. However, for the student award competition, **only abstracts are eligible** (case reports will not be accepted). Each presenter may enter **one abstract only** for award consideration; if multiple abstracts are submitted, the presenter must indicate which abstract should be judged for the competition.

# The In-Person Student/Trainee Awards Competition is Back!

Judges will review all abstracts submitted for award consideration in advance of the conference and select the **top abstracts** for in-person poster presentation judging. Final judging will take place during the conference.

- All Abstracts and Case Reports must submit an e-poster through the Oxford Online Platform by **April 20, 2026.** The e-posters will be used for identification purposes within the app and for potential publication in the JAMMI supplement.
- Accepted abstracts and case reports will be published in the Journal of the Association of Medical Microbiology and Infectious Diseases Canada (JAMMI) after the conference and will be accessible online via the conference website.



- Ensure that you have approval from all authors to submit your abstract/case report before submitting.
- Abstract and case reports NOT eligible for submission include:
  - Abstracts/Case Reports which have already been published in a peer-reviewed journal at the time of the abstract submission deadline, Monday, January 12, 2026. (Note: abstracts will still be considered if the abstract/ manuscript is in the submission stage but not yet accepted at the time of the abstract/case report deadline).
  - Abstract/case reports which have been presented at an international conference previously without any updated or additional data.

The annual conference accommodates a fixed number of oral, rapid fire and poster presentations

THE ABSTRACT/CASE REPORT COMMITTEE WILL DETERMINE THE FINAL PRESENTATION FORMAT AND SCHEDULE.

#### **SUBMISSION AND AMENDING PROCESS**

- All abstracts and case reports must be submitted using the online submission site. Amendments to previous submissions may be made online, up to the submission deadline of Monday, January 12, 2026 11:59 PST.
  - **NEW USERS:** Please select "Register a New Account" to create your sign in credentials. This is required to make abstract/ case report submissions and amendments.
  - RETURNING USERS: Please sign in using your email and password to manage new or existing abstract/case report submissions.
- Log into the submission system when your abstract/case report's text is prepared. Log in by entering the email address and the password you chose when you registered with the system.
- When you click the "Log In" button you will be taken to a screen to create a new abstract/case report submission. Please read the instructions on the screen carefully. If you have already submitted an abstract/case report and you would like to make changes you can click "Amend A Previous Submission". Corrections to abstracts/case reports can only be made up to the submission deadline of Monday, January 12, 2026 11:59 PST.
- Follow the instructions listed to complete all necessary fields. Some questions are marked with an asterisk (\*), which indicates that a field is mandatory. We cannot accept your abstract/case report until these questions have been answered. Once you have completed all required fields, click the "SUBMIT" button, which will save your current abstract/ case report submission. The page that follows will display the status of your submission as **Complete or Incomplete**.
  - N.B.: ONLY COMPLETE SUBMISSIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED AND PEER REVIEWED.
- Upon successful electronic submission of your abstract/case report, you will receive a confirmation by email from the Oxford Abstracts submission site with your abstract/case report's reference code and a PDF preview of your submission. Please check your junk folder and ensure you grant access to Oxford Abstracts.



# **Student/Trainee Abstract Submission and Awards Criteria**

#### **REVIEW AND COMPLIANCE**

- All abstracts and case reports will be subject to peer review by at least two (2) members of the Review Committee.
- Abstracts will be graded on scientific content, interest and relevance to infectious diseases and microbiology.
- Submitting authors will be notified of the abstract/case report acceptance/rejection, presentation date and time and format of presentation the week of March 09, 2026. Please check your junk folders for communications and ensure you grant access to Oxford Abstracts.
- If an abstract/case report is accepted, the presenting author must be registered for the conference no later than Friday, March 20, 2026.
- If a presenting author withdraws an abstract/case report after the registration deadline or does not attend the session for which they have been scheduled, the author will be prohibited from presenting abstract/case reports at the AMMI Canada-CACMID Annual Conference for a period of three (3) years. Those subject to this penalty will be informed in writing.

## **SUBMIT AN ABSTRACT/CASE REPORT**

### STUDENT/TRAINEE ABSTRACT SUBMISSION AND AWARDS CRITERIA

- While students/trainees may submit multiple abstracts, only one (1) can be considered for the award. The submitter must designate which abstract they wish to enter into the competition at the time of submission.
- To be eligible for award consideration, you must be a current student, in training, or have completed your training within nine (9) months prior to the annual conference.
- The abstract must be submitted under the student category at the time of submission to qualify for the award competition.
- Please carefully review all questions related to the awards competition criteria during the submission process.
- Only one (1) abstract per student/trainee may be submitted for award consideration.

# Student/Trainee Abstract Submission and Awards Criteria

#### GENERAL CRITERIA FOR ALL STUDENT'S COMPETING IN THE AWARDS COMPETITION

(please see below for additional criteria pertaining to each specific award)

- · Case Report submissions are NOT eligible for award consideration.
- · Individual students, residents and fellows are eligible for student awards.
- Student/trainees must be in training or have completed their training within nine (9) months prior to the annual conference.
- · The student/trainee must be the first author of the abstract.
